

## **REPORT ALERT:**

### **PENNSYLVANIA 2015 SUPREME COURT RACE - SUSPICIOUS PATTERNS IDENTIFIED**

A GRASSROOTS INVESTIGATION

**\*\*Disclaimer: Many volunteers recorded, counted and analyzed what they observed in precinct election results across Chester County, and other counties across Pennsylvania. Though inspected several times, the opportunity exists for human error to be found in what was recorded in any of the charts shown, numbers counted, statements made, etc. in this report. Due to this, it is asked that all authority be placed upon the official precinct and cumulative election results released by the Pennsylvania counties. They are linked to this report. They are official and speak for themselves. This report seeks to shine a light onto what volunteers have observed across Chester County and other Pennsylvania counties in over a decade of election results.**

**\*\*It is believed that all candidates featured have done nothing wrong. They are considered innocent as they do not program nor operate voting machines.** The question that prevails is who was programming the voting machines for each of the elections shown, and do they know if any unauthorized software was in use?

## 2015 PA SUPREME COURT REPORT PRELUDE

**Note: The lowest/highest pattern had not yet been discovered when this report was originally written. A glimpse of the pattern was later found in the initial Atglen precinct, but was not researched any further throughout this report.**

Let's imagine there is going to be an election – one where voters will vote for three Justices of their state Supreme Court, Judge of the Superior Court, Judge of the Commonwealth Court, and Judge of the Court of Common Pleas. Additional races and candidates are left out simply due to lack of space for this illustration.

Around 100 Republican voters and 80 Democrat voters show up to vote. After the voters go to their precincts to vote, eventually the results are posted into a precinct report. (On election night it is posted as unofficial, after certification it is posted as official).

As you can see, the Republicans won all races, and their vote totals were pretty close in each race. Now imagine a bad actor wanted to lower the amount of votes each Republican Supreme Court candidate received.

The bad actor installs secret unauthorized software onto the voting machines that automatically takes 20 votes off the first Republican Supreme Court Candidate Bob, 25 votes off the second Republican Supreme Court Candidate Mary, and 30 votes off the third Republican Supreme Court Candidate Jill. It is uncertain where each Republican candidates' votes that were removed then go.

Now that the secret unauthorized software was applied to the vote totals, we see the three Republican Supreme Court candidates' totals reduced.

Now the three Republican Supreme Court candidates are the only Republican candidates that lose their races on the ballot in this precinct.

What else is noticed of this new outcome?

We notice that the Republican Supreme Court candidates now have the lowest vote totals of all Republican candidates on the ballot in this precinct. Their vote totals are 76, 75 and 68, which are lower than all the other Republican candidates' totals.

Now take what you see in this imaginative demonstration, and think about it when you read about the “lowest vote total” pattern being found in the 2015 Supreme Court races in Chester County, PA and other counties across the Commonwealth. What conclusions do you draw? Could vote total manipulation be a real possibility, or not at all?

What if 20, 25 and 30 votes specifically were not programmed to be taken off the Republican Supreme Court candidates, but instead, some percentage of each of their total votes that a computer algorithm figures out? What if this algorithm is set so that each precinct removes a specific amount of votes off the Republican Supreme Court candidates which then, when added up, results in a “pre-set” or “pre-determined” final result number?

Could it be possible that multiple races in an election can have their votes manipulated?

It will be noticed in this report that the Republican school director candidates will also appear to have low vote totals in many instances. For right now, to help keep this illustration easy to understand, the Supreme Court races are the only races focused on.

Keep in mind how the Republican Supreme Court candidates ended up with the lowest Republican vote totals. The concept of *how* this could have happened is what is trying to be explained in this imaginary illustration.

\*\*There is a missing piece to the following report, and that is why is the “lowest/highest” pattern not featured for the most part? While the lowest vote total pattern was apparent, researchers had not yet discovered the lowest/highest pattern when this report was originally written. Further research showed that splitting the races up into groups could cause the lowest/highest pattern to reappear in Municipal elections. The key is to find the correct groupings of candidates. For example, if the races were split into state and county groups, it might then show the lowest/highest pattern for one race in each group. But state and county is not the only way the races could be divided.

Hints of interesting vote totals in the Commissioner and Court of Common Pleas races may help guide further investigation into finding the lowest/highest pattern for this election.

The low vote total pattern that is present is still very concerning as it is seen across multiple counties across the Commonwealth. Reading this report is highly encouraged.

**2015 PENNSYLVANIA SUPREME COURT RACE - SUSPICIOUS PATTERNS IDENTIFIED**

An investigation into 11 years of precinct-level election results in Chester County, Pennsylvania has uncovered shocking patterns in judicial candidate vote totals, both in the county and across the Commonwealth. These vote total patterns have been observed in every general election since 2013 in Chester County.

In 2015, the patterns show the same Republican Supreme Court candidates repeatedly earning some of the lowest vote totals out of all the Republican candidates on the ballot. This pattern occurred in 223 out of 227 Chester County precincts. Democrats went on to take majority control of the Pennsylvania Supreme Court after this election. A lowest/highest pattern was found after the initial writing of this report, and an example of it was later added to the first precinct example shown. This pattern causes concern of vote swapping.

This seemingly unnatural consistency throughout most precincts causes great concern among Pennsylvania citizens that this race may have been targeted for a fraudulent outcome. It also raises the following questions: Why would Republicans from nearly every precinct not want to vote for Republican Supreme Court candidates? Could votes have been taken away from Republican Supreme Court candidates and given to their Democrat opponents? Could just enough votes have been taken away from Republican Supreme Court candidates, in strong Republican precincts, to keep them winning without anyone noticing they have lower vote totals than all of their fellow candidates?

Were votes removed from Republican Supreme Court Candidate Anne Covey and added to opponent Kevin Dougherty? Were votes Removed from Republican County Commissioner Candidate Michelle Kichline and added to opponent Kathi Cozzone? Or was this outcome natural?

All three Republican Supreme Court candidates received the lowest vote totals out of all Republican candidates in the Atglen precinct. This similar pattern occurred throughout many "Republican-winning" precincts in Chester County. You will notice that even though the Supreme Court candidates won their races in this precinct, they won by lower vote totals than Republican candidates in other races.

Similar patterns in counties across the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania have created additional concern about the 2015 election. While Republican Supreme Court candidates may have won in certain counties, were their vote totals reduced just enough to adversely affect the final outcome state-wide?

Continuing on with 2015, the lowest vote total pattern also emerges in "Democrat-winning" precincts. See an example below in the [Valley North](#) precinct:

All three Republican Supreme Court candidates receive the lowest vote totals out of all Republican candidates in state and county-wide races.

Notice the Republican District Attorney, Sheriff, Prothonotary, Register of Wills and Recorder of Deeds candidates all have higher vote totals than the top-of-the-ballot Republican candidates above them.

The final numbers have the Republican Supreme Court, Superior Court, Commonwealth Court, Court of Common Pleas and County Commissioner candidates earning lower votes than all Republicans in remaining row office races. Are Republican votes being taken off the top of the ballot candidates and added to their Democrat challengers? If true, would it be hard to notice in municipal election precinct reports, while having a major impact on final statewide totals? Municipal elections can have many more candidates on the ballot, and multiple candidates running for the same race. This can make voting patterns much more difficult to analyze in municipal elections than in federal elections.

The following are 2015 summary reports from Beaver, Washington, Bucks, Montgomery, Delaware, Northampton, Allegheny, Lehigh, Westmoreland, York and Centre counties. *In all eleven counties, the Republican Supreme Court candidates earn among the lowest vote totals of all Republican candidates in state and county-wide races.*

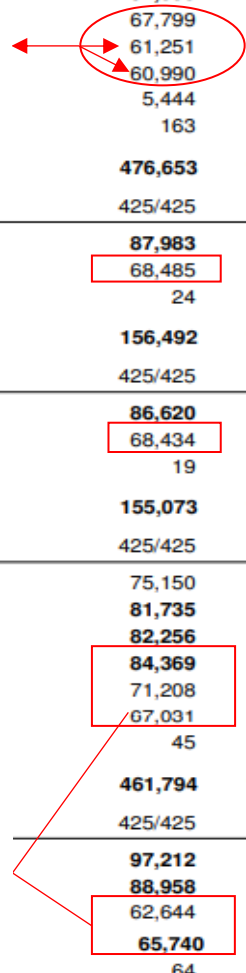

After analyzing this 2015 sample of PA counties, many of them with high populations, it becomes apparent that Republican Supreme Court candidates consistently received the lowest vote totals when compared to their fellow state and county-wide Republican candidates. This matches Chester County's summary report where 3/3 Republican Supreme Court candidates received the lowest vote totals of all Republican candidates on the ballot. In review, 2/3 Republican Supreme Court candidates received the lowest vote totals in 223/227 precincts, and 3/3 of the Republican Supreme Court candidates received the lowest totals in 126/227 precincts in Chester County. These precinct-level results set off a signal over Republican Supreme Court candidates consistently receiving the lowest vote totals, which reflected in the final summary report of Chester County's election vote totals.

As a result of the 2015 General Election, Democrats took control of the Pennsylvania Supreme Court.

Looking ahead to 2017, Republican Supreme Court Candidate Sallie Mundy received the highest vote total of all the other Republican candidates in the state and county-wide races. This is a [total reverse](#) of what happened in 2015. See below:

What was the outcome of the PA State Supreme Court race in 2017? Sally Mundy won her race.

While the Democrats held the majority on the PA Supreme Court, Mundy’s win meant a Republican justice won a full term with the PA Supreme Court. Was her win a natural outcome? Did the Democrat PA Supreme Court takeover happen naturally in 2015? Candidates need to start investigating their wins and losses.

In conclusion, a question remains: Was an algorithm run, causing votes to be deducted from the PA Republican Supreme Court candidates? If this is true, would this be the cause for low Republican vote totals. It is past time to ask our county Boards of Elections and Voter Services departments for answers, and ask for no more voting machines to be used in any election going forward. Hand counting all voting methods at the precincts is crucial.

The same patterns occurred in over a decade of Chester County races including the 2016 and 2020 Presidential, State Treasurer and Attorney General races, the 2014, 2018 and 2022 Governor races (most profound) and every 2013 – 2023 Municipal election with the Judicial and School Director races. **See the reports on these races at <https://votepatterns.com> .**

## **CRITICAL PROACTIVE STEPS YOU CAN TAKE BEFORE THE CERTIFICATION OF THE NOVEMBER 2024 GENERAL ELECTION:**

### **Please be peaceful, respectful and lawful when performing the following tasks:**

1. **If you reside in Chester County, Pennsylvania please attend your local commissioner and board of elections meetings immediately and ask for answers to how these patterns are happening.** Attend each meeting until the November election. There are public comment periods during the meetings. In Chester County, each person gets 3 minutes to speak, other counties and states may vary. Dates and times of these meetings in Chester County are posted [HERE](#). They are generally on weekdays in the mid-morning. Contact your commissioners at their offices by phone and email. Ask for the elimination of all-voting machines this November and that all ballots, including mail-in ballots, are hand counted at the precincts. Say NO to centralized hand counting done by Voter Services, even in an emergency. Ask them to train all of their Judges of Elections, Majority Inspectors, Minority Inspectors and clerks (poll workers) how to hand count ballots before November. A helpful resource may be to review [25 Pa. Stat. § 3062](#) which addresses how ballots were counted in PA prior to voting machines. Additional resources are available [here](#) and [here](#).

2. **Do a lowest/highest analysis for both parties on the 2022 General Election to determine precincts where poll watchers should be placed for November 2024.** Get the 2022 precinct report from your county government website under the election results archive section. This might be found under an elections tab, voter services tab, etc. See which

Republican candidate has the lowest vote total in each precinct, and which Democratic candidate has the highest vote total in each precinct. Then do the reverse. Which Democratic candidate has the highest vote total, and which Republican candidate has the lowest vote total throughout every precinct. Poll watchers should go to any precincts that do not follow the patterns that appear in the analysis, and also any precincts that show tie races in the analysis (for example, two races both get the lowest vote total of all R candidates).

3. Take close-up pictures (in sections, top to bottom) and videos of all of the printed out voting machine tapes at the end of the night on election day at your precinct (after 8 p.m.). Make sure the photos and videos are clear and every race and their votes are clearly readable. For the videos, start at the top of the tape and work down to the bottom. Keep the video under one minute long. They should be hung up on a door or in an area for the public to view at each precinct. PA Election Code Article XI-A, Section 1113-A (f) indicates that regarding the tapes, one such record shall be **publicly posted** at the district polling place. HERE is the election code you can print out and show if you have any issues. If you can get to other precincts and take pictures/videos of theirs, please do. Also have mail-in ballot observers ask for printed out copies of the mail-in ballot tabulator reports after the batches are finished being counted. If you cannot get a copy, write down all the races and their vote totals in a notebook. In Chester County, Take pictures of the reports (or your notes of the results) and make sure they are clearly readable, then upload the tapes and reports to <https://votepatterns.com>. Pictures and videos of tapes/reports from every precinct need to be obtained in case any issues arise that prevent the election night reporting websites from functioning or being able to give results. These tapes, videos and reports will be analyzed with the lowest vote total and highest vote total analysis for each party to see if any patterns appear. All precinct tapes/reports are needed so they can all be compared to each other. If you do not live in Chester County, find someone to organize where all of this information should be collected.
4. If there are no issues with your county's internet website, and precinct reports are available, as soon as your county posts their election results on the internet on election night, print out and take pictures and videos of your precinct's results and every individual precinct's results that you can in the county. Make sure you get pictures and video of all the races' scores. All precinct reports for the entire county need to be obtained as soon as possible. Have printer ink ready in your printer. Videos need to be under 1 minute long. In Chester County, upload pictures and videos of your online precinct report to <http://votepatterns.com>.
5. Record how many votes each Republican and Democratic candidate won or lost their race by in each precinct. Doing this showed clear patterns in previous elections. This also will show other races with patterns that might not originally show up in the lowest/highest analysis, especially down-ballot races. Email your analysis of a Chester County precinct to [info@votepatterns.com](mailto:info@votepatterns.com). You can also take pictures of your findings and upload them to <https://votepatterns.com>.
6. Become a poll watcher at the most critical precincts in your county. Be a poll watcher at a precinct that has not been following the patterns. Make sure you or others are there for the opening and closing of the precinct especially, but all day coverage is needed. Watch to make sure that no one is going into any back rooms or offices to make additional fraudulent ballots. Watch for bags or boxes going into other rooms. Ask to see the poll book at the opening of the day before voters arrive to make sure signatures are not already in them. Above all, make sure you follow your county's rules for poll watchers. If you are being blocked from accessing an area you believe you should be able to observe, ask a constable for assistance.
7. Become a mail-in ballot observer. Observe the transportation of them from the ballot intake area to the counting room if allowed. Watch for carts of ballots going in and out of side rooms they shouldn't be in. Stay until the very end of counting and ask to get a copy of or see the reports that come from the mail-in ballot tabulators. Take notes in a notebook of the race totals in the reports by batch. If a precinct's results are spread out in multiple batches, add the grand total up before taking a picture and uploading it. Take a picture/video of your notes, make sure it is clearly readable, and upload them to https://votepatterns.com if you live in Chester County.
8. Vote in person, on election day. Do not vote by mail-in ballot. Cast Vote Records from around the country show that early mail-in ballots are being manipulated. If there is cheating going on through voting machine manipulation, the one way to beat it is to have record turnout where everyone in the voter rolls is voting. Do not think that your vote is a waste of time due to cheating. It can overpower any cheat if enough people vote.

9. If you are a poll watcher at a precinct on election day, determine if the number of ballots handed out is tracked and, if so, find out and report that number at the end of the day. If the number of ballots given out is not being tracked, respectfully ask that they be counted as they are handed out to voters.
10. For poll watchers, be on the lookout for complaints from voters who are told that they already voted via mail-in ballot. Encourage any such voters to immediately register an identity theft claim with the local sheriff.
11. It is becoming clear that the USB sticks need to be inspected by bipartisan members of the public before they are plugged into voting tabulators to make sure there are no preloaded ballots or unauthorized, additional software/malware etc. on them. The Election Management System also needs to be examined by a bipartisan group from the public to confirm no unauthorized software or hardware exists in it. What can be done so that there is a clear transparency as to what is on the county Election Management System and the USB sticks that go to the tabulators, immediately prior to each election? Who programs your county's USB sticks and voting machines before each election? Who runs the Election Management System? How can the public know there is not unauthorized software/hardware/malware on them? Please ask your local county commissioners for the answers to these questions.

1. Do lowest/highest analysis on 2022 to determine precincts where poll watchers should be placed.
2. Get pictures and videos of your precinct voting machine tapes. Upload them to: <https://votepatterns.com>
3. Get pictures and videos of the mail-in ballot tabulator reports. Upload them to: <https://votepatterns.com>
4. Get pictures and videos of your online precinct report on your county election results website. Upload them to: <https://votepatterns.com>
5. Record how many votes each Republican candidate won or lost their race by in each precinct. You can also do it for Democratic candidates. Doing this showed clear patterns in previous elections. Email your results to [info@votepatterns.com](mailto:info@votepatterns.com)
6. Sign up to be a poll watcher or mail-in ballot observer.
7. Vote on election day. Do not vote by mail-in ballot.
8. If you find significant patterns and you are not in Chester County, report your findings to any candidates that are affected.
9. Get to your county Commissioner and Board of Elections meetings and ask for answers to these patterns and for them to eliminate voting machines this November in favor of counting all types of paper ballots by hand, at the precincts. Make sure they are ready to switch to hand counting should any issues occur.
